



### EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

- ALL OCCUPANTS TO PUT ON PFDs**  
PFDs must be easily accessible and all persons on board should know how to use them.
- INFORM** a person of your trip intentions
- PHONE** Call 000
- CHECK** the marine weather report
- MAINTAIN** a good lookout and operate at a safe speed
- STAY WITH YOUR BOAT**  
A vessel is a lot easier to spot than a swimmer. Anchor your boat to maintain position if safe to do so.

No Vessel of more than 6 metres in length and 2.5 metres in beam is permitted on the Barwon River.

**Vessels with engines shall be permitted:**

- Sunday between the hours of midday and sunset
- Between Christmas Day and the following New Year's Day or any public holiday gazetted in substitution for that New Year's Day (both days inclusive).
- Vessels with engines used for propulsion at a speed of no more than 5 knots which is solely for the purpose of coaching rowing crews.

Exclusive use - water skiing zone. Vessels with an engine (less than 12 kilowatts of developed power) may transit the special purpose area. But must keep as near to the starboard bank as is practical.

# BARWON RIVER (BETWEEN THE LOWER BREAKWATER AND ORANA ROAD)

Waterway Manager - Corangamite Catchment Management Authority (Ph: 5232 9100)

- Waters of the Barwon River
- Waters where vessels with engines are prohibited
- Speed Limit Zone
- Buoy
- Water Skiing (Access Lane)
- Waters outside those specified in Schedule 7
- Special Purpose Area
- Sign / Post / Beacon
- Boat Ramp

A person must not operate a vessel on the waters of the Barwon River (between the Lower Breakwater and Orana Road) at a speed exceeding 5 knots -  
 (a) within 50 metres of the waters edge; or  
 (b) within 50 metres of a fixed or floating structure in or on the water - except in an access lane
