ALL OCCUPANTS TO PUT ON PFDs
PFDs must be easily accessible and all persons on board should know how to use them.



INFORM
a person of your trip intentions



CHECK
the marine weather report



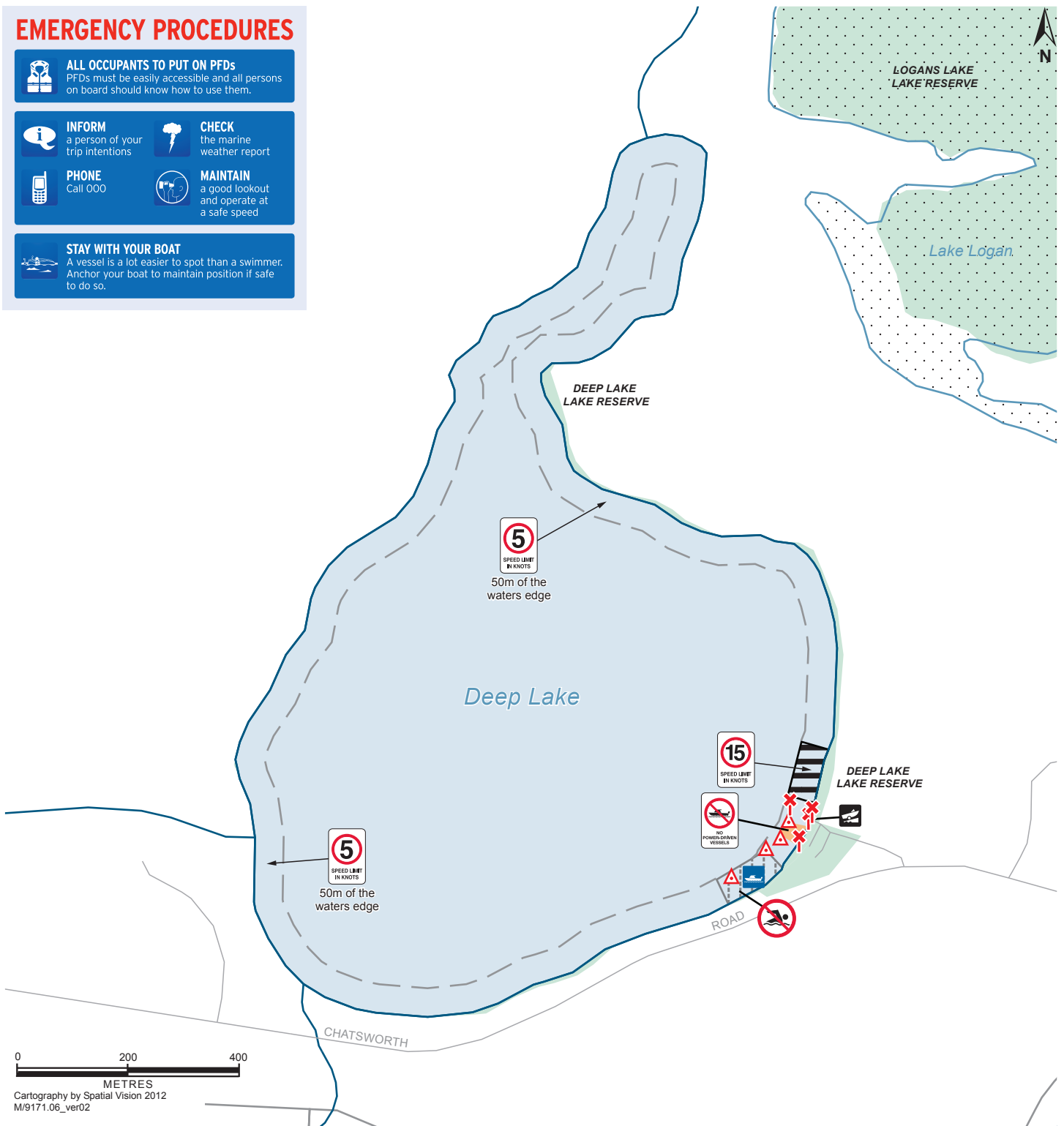

A person must not operate a vessel on the waters of Deep Lake at a speed exceeding 5 knots -
(a) within 50 metres of the waters edge; or
(b) within 50 metres of a fixed or floating structure in or on the water - except in an access lane
