



### EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

- ALL OCCUPANTS TO PUT ON PFDs**  
PFDs must be easily accessible and all persons on board should know how to use them.
- INFORM**  
a person of your trip intentions
- CHECK**  
the marine weather report
- PHONE**  
Call 000
- MAINTAIN**  
a good lookout and operate at a safe speed
- STAY WITH YOUR BOAT**  
A vessel is a lot easier to spot than a swimmer. Anchor your boat to maintain position if safe to do so.

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## WATERS - SURREY RIVER (BETWEEN THE SEAWARD OUTLET AND THE PRINCES HIGHWAY BRIDGE)

Waterway Manager - The Committee of Management of Narrawong Camping and Recreation Reserve Corporation

- Waters of the Surrey River
- Speed Limit Zone
- No vessels with engines
- No Personal Watercraft
- Sign / Post / Beacon
- Waters outside those specified in Schedule 26
- Vessels with engines prohibited
- No Water Skiing
- Dangerous sea conditions
- Boat ramp

A person must not operate a vessel on the waters of the Surrey River (between the seaward outlet and the Princes Highway bridge) at a speed exceeding 5 knots -  
 (a) within 50 metres of the waters edge; or  
 (b) within 50 metres of a fixed or floating structure in or on the water - except in an access lane
