



EMERGENCY PROCEDURES



ALL OCCUPANTS TO PUT ON PFDs

PFDs must be easily accessible and all persons on board should know how to use them.



INFORM

a person of your trip intentions



CHECK

the marine weather report



PHONE

Call 000



MAINTAIN

a good lookout and operate at a safe speed



STAY WITH YOUR BOAT

A vessel is a lot easier to spot than a swimmer. Anchor your boat to maintain position if safe to do so.

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A person must not operate a vessel on the waters of Cairn Curran Reservoir at a speed exceeding 5 knots - (b) within 50 metres of a fixed or floating structure in or on the water - except in an access lane
