**ALL OCCUPANTS TO PUT ON PFDs**  
PFDs must be easily accessible and all persons on board should know how to use them.



**INFORM**  
a person of your trip intentions



**CHECK**  
the marine weather report



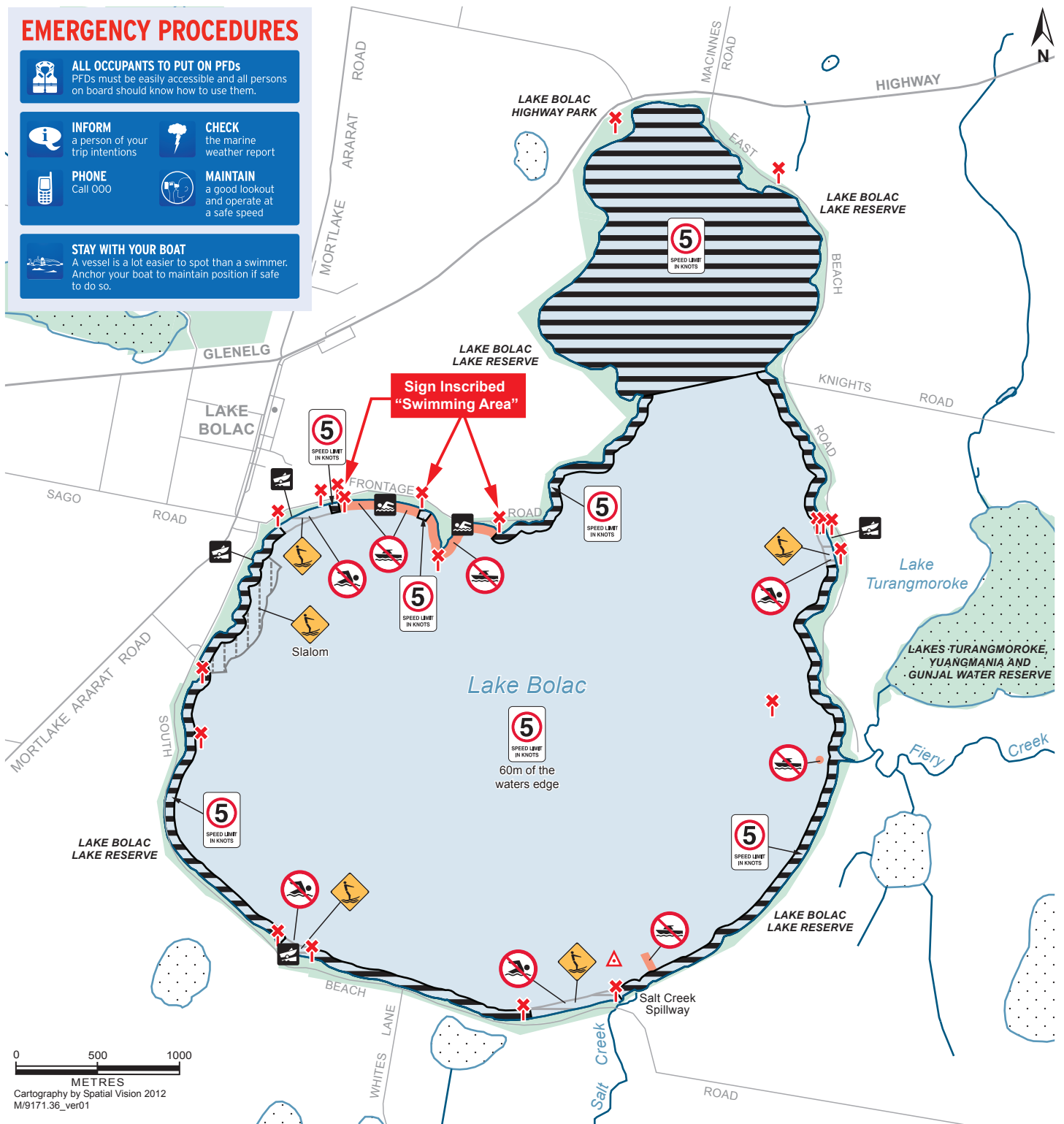
**PHONE**

A person must not operate a vessel on the waters of Lake Bolac at a speed exceeding 5 knots -  
(a) within 60 metres of the waters edge; or  
(b) within 50 metres of a fixed or floating structure in or on the water - except in an access lane
