

**Vessels with engines used for propulsion and water-skiing shall only be permitted in the special purpose areas at the following times:**

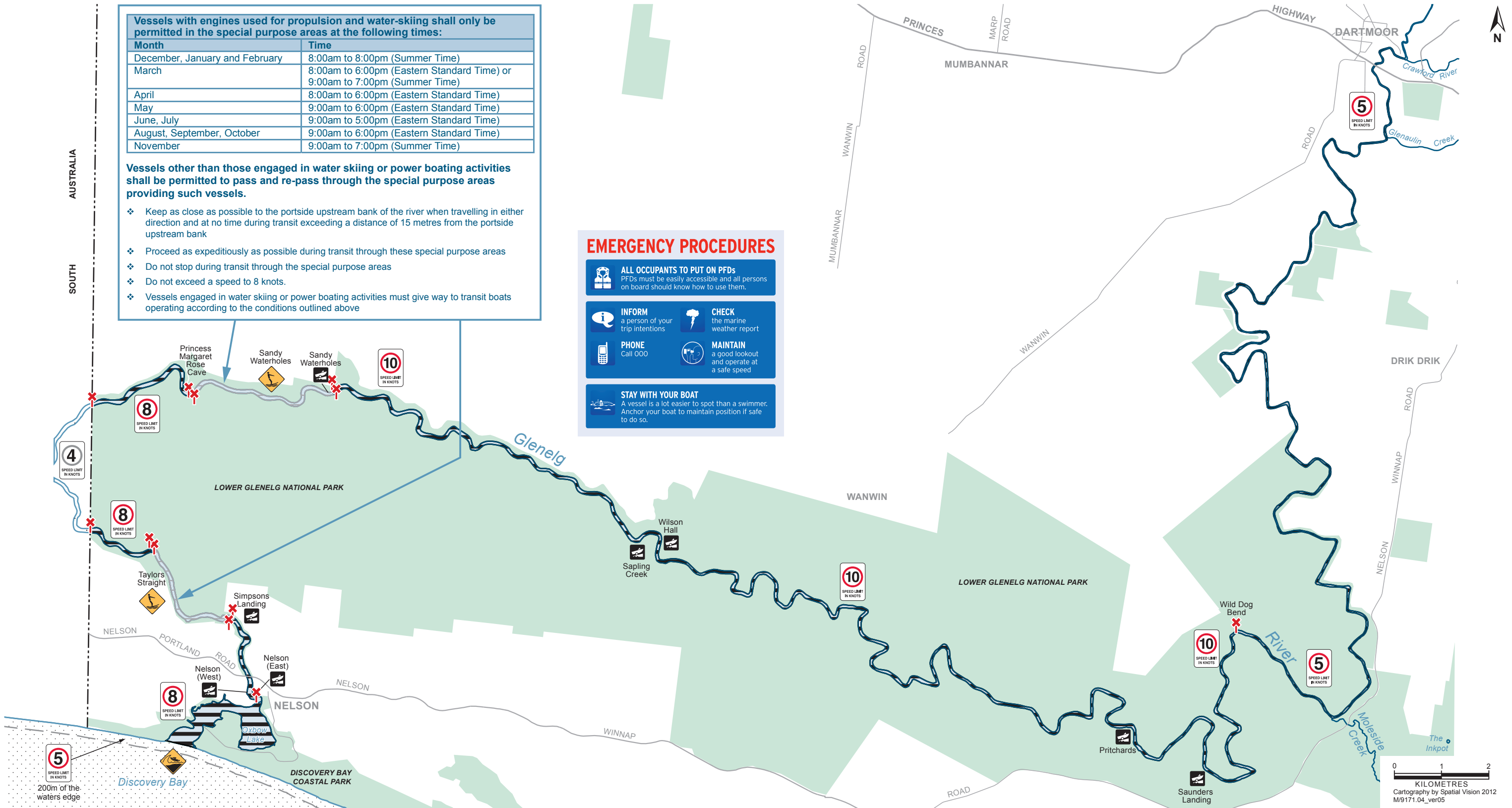
Month	Time
December, January and February	8:00am to 8:00pm (Summer Time)
March	8:00am to 6:00pm (Eastern Standard Time) or 9:00am to 7:00pm (Summer Time)
April	8:00am to 6:00pm (Eastern Standard Time)
May	9:00am to 6:00pm (Eastern Standard Time)
June, July	9:00am to 5:00pm (Eastern Standard Time)
August, September, October	9:00am to 6:00pm (Eastern Standard Time)
November	9:00am to 7:00pm (Summer Time)

**Vessels other than those engaged in water skiing or power boating activities shall be permitted to pass and re-pass through the special purpose areas providing such vessels.**

- ❖ Keep as close as possible to the portside upstream bank of the river when travelling in either direction and at no time during transit exceeding a distance of 15 metres from the portside upstream bank
- ❖ Proceed as expeditiously as possible during transit through these special purpose areas
- ❖ Do not stop during transit through the special purpose areas
- ❖ Do not exceed a speed to 8 knots.
- ❖ Vessels engaged in water skiing or power boating activities must give way to transit boats operating according to the conditions outlined above

### EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

- ALL OCCUPANTS TO PUT ON PFDs**  
PFDs must be easily accessible and all persons on board should know how to use them.
- INFORM**  
a person of your trip intentions
- PHONE**  
Call 000
- CHECK**  
the marine weather report
- MAINTAIN**  
a good lookout and operate at a safe speed
- STAY WITH YOUR BOAT**  
A vessel is a lot easier to spot than a swimmer. Anchor your boat to maintain position if safe to do so.



## THE GLENELG RIVER WITHIN VICTORIA BETWEEN THE MOUTH AND THE JUNCTION WITH THE CRAWFORD RIVER AT DARTMOOR

General Vessel Operating and Zoning Rules for this waterway:

- ❖ A person must not operate, anchor or moor a houseboat on any waters of the Glenelg River within Victoria, from the mouth of the River to the junction of the River with the Crawford River at Dartmoor



A person must not operate a vessel on the waters of the Glenelg River at a speed exceeding 5 knots -  
 (a) within 50 metres of the waters edge; or  
 (b) within 50 metres of a fixed or floating structure in or on the water - except in an access lane
