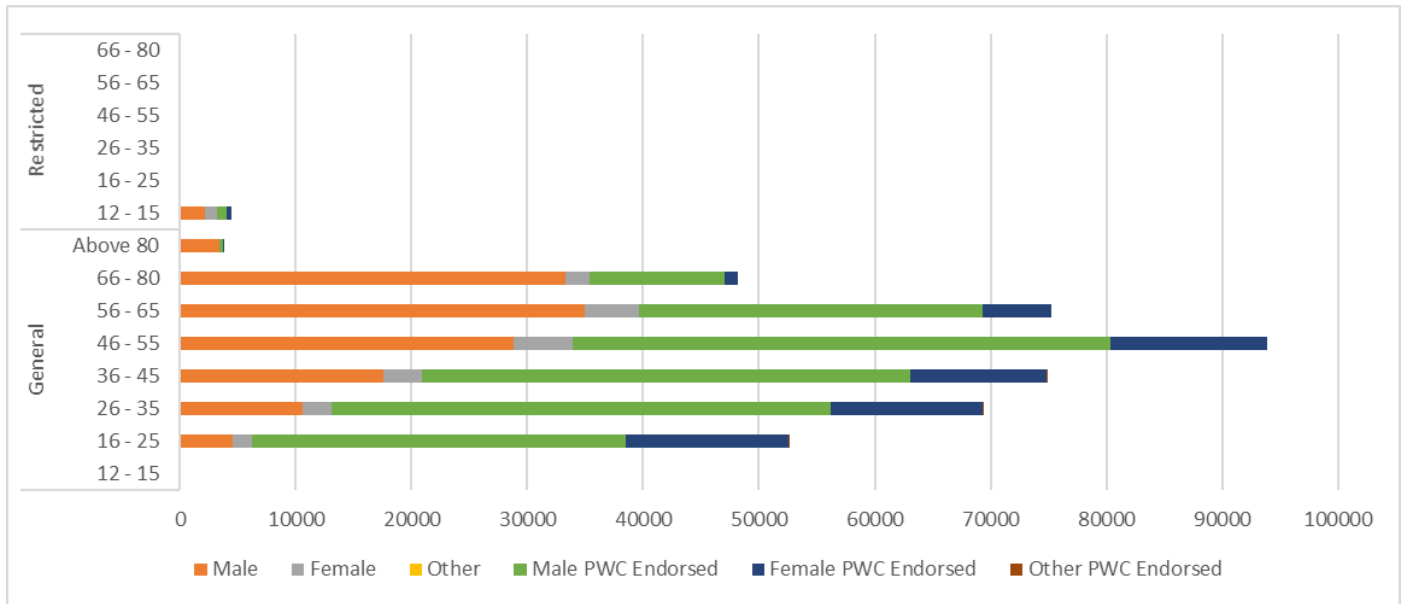

## Registration and licensing numbers

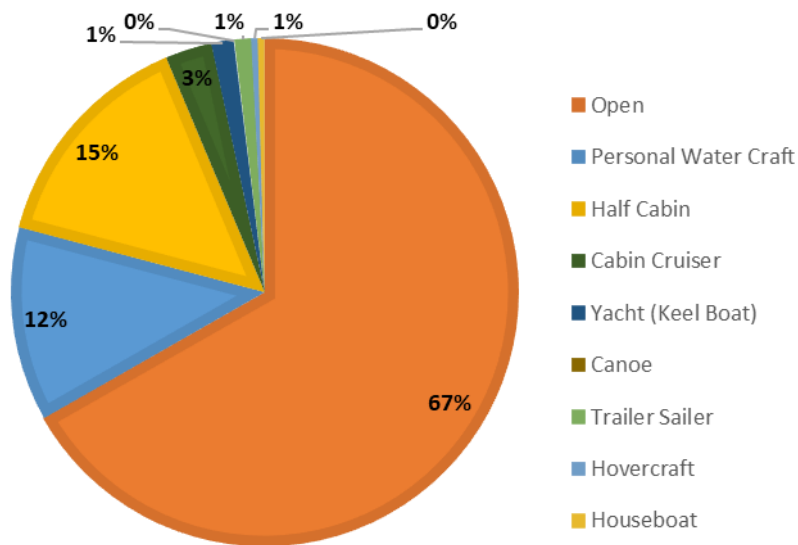
**Graph 1 - Licence type by Age and Gender**

As of 30 June 2020, the total number of Victorian recreational boating licence holders for 2019/20 was **422,000**.



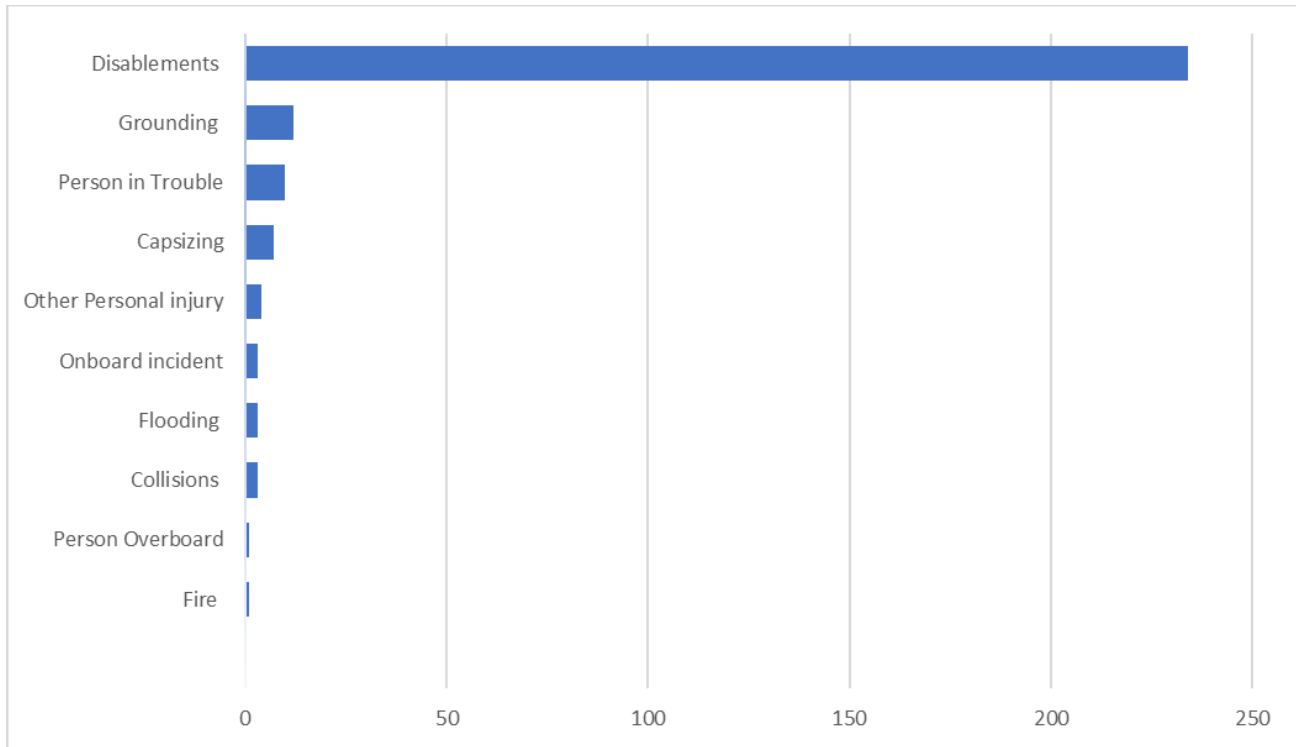
**Graph 2 - Fleet by Vessel Type**

As of 30 June 2020, the total number of registered vessels for 2019/20 was **198,000**. This data covers both new registrations and renewals.



### Graph 3 - Incidents

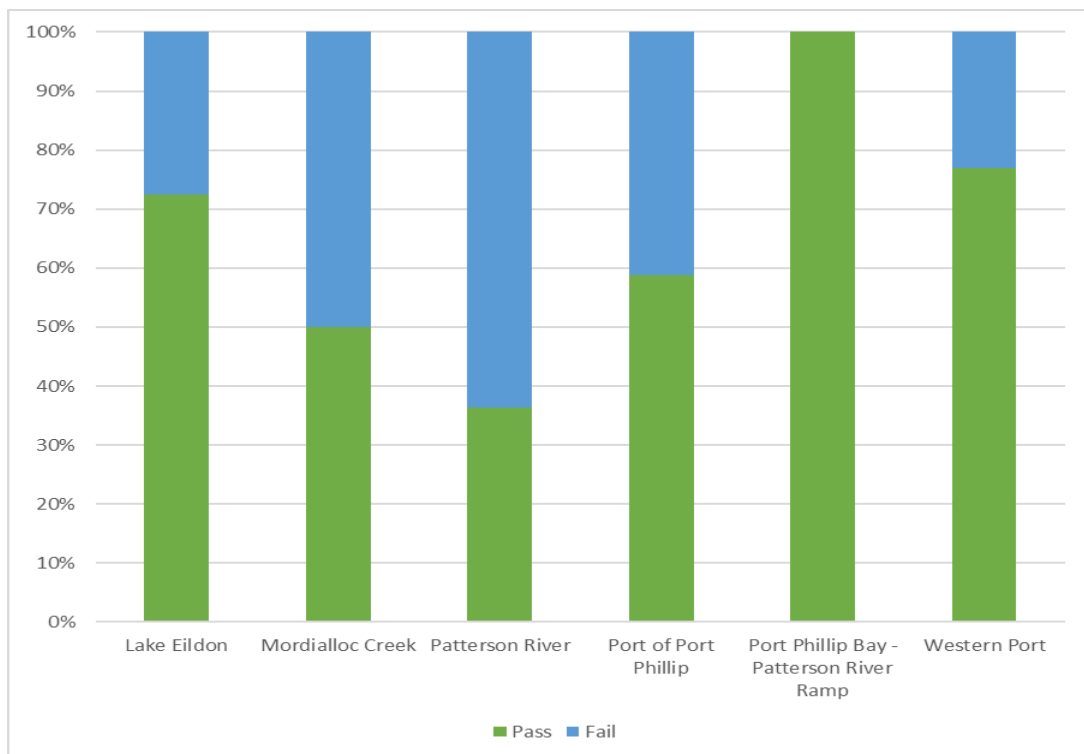
From 2 March 2020 to 30 June 2020, there have been **287** recreational marine incidents. The majority of these incidents (84%) were vessel disablements.



### Compliance monitoring

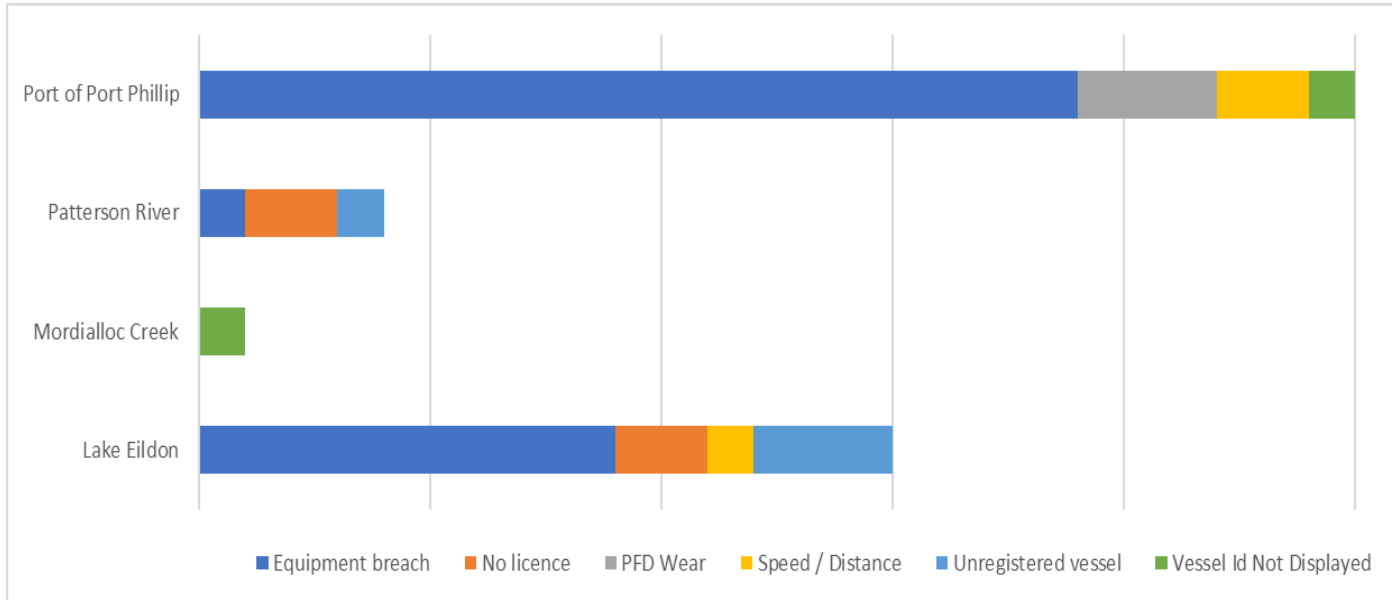
#### Graph 4 - MSV Inspections by waterway

From 2 March 2020 to 30 June 2020, of the vessel inspections undertaken **64%** of inspections passed (i.e. the inspection did not detect any offences).



**Graph 5 - MSV Infringements by Waterway**

From 2 March 2020 to 30 June 2020, of the infringements issued, Lake Eildon saw a higher non-compliance rate with unregistered vessels and unlicensed enclosed waters saw a higher non-compliance in respect to the carriage of correct equipment.



**Graph 6- MSV Infringements by Vessel Type**

From 2 March 2020 to 30 June 2020, the majority of infringements issued (64%) were for breaches of safety equipment.
