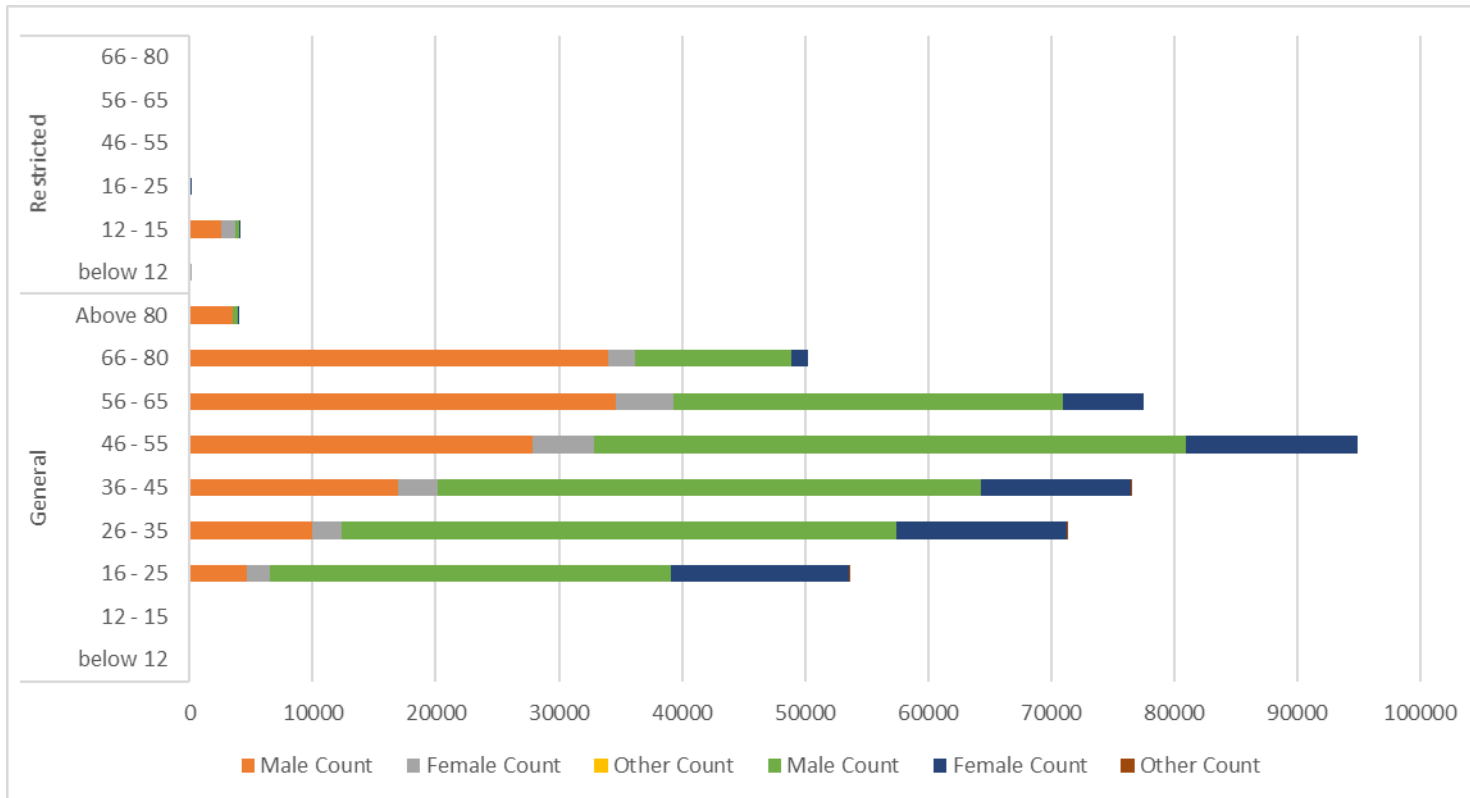

Registration and licensing numbers

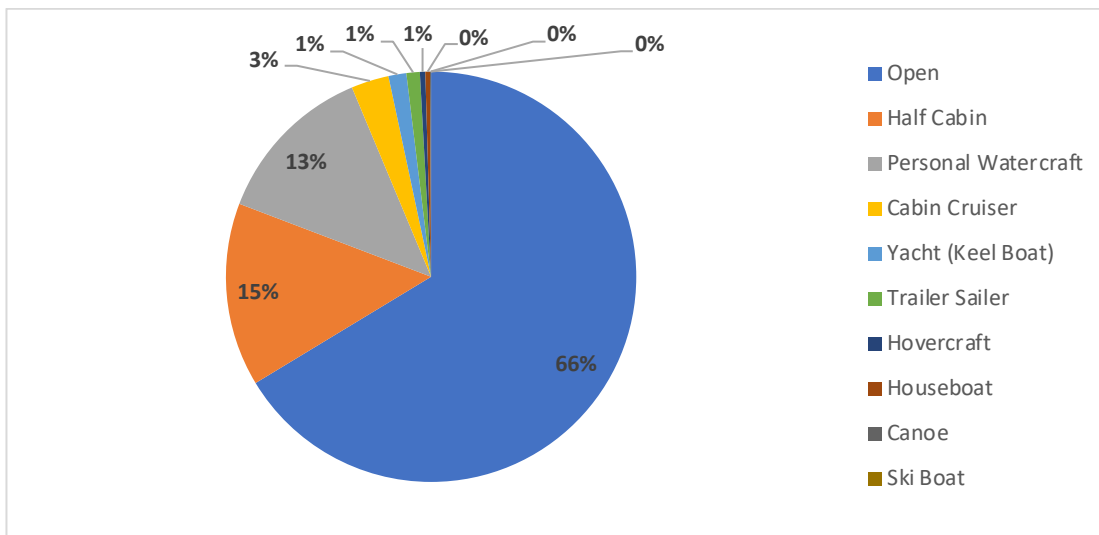
Graph 1 - Licence type by age and gender

As of 1 January to 31 March 2021, the total number of Victorian recreational boating licence holders was **432,000**.



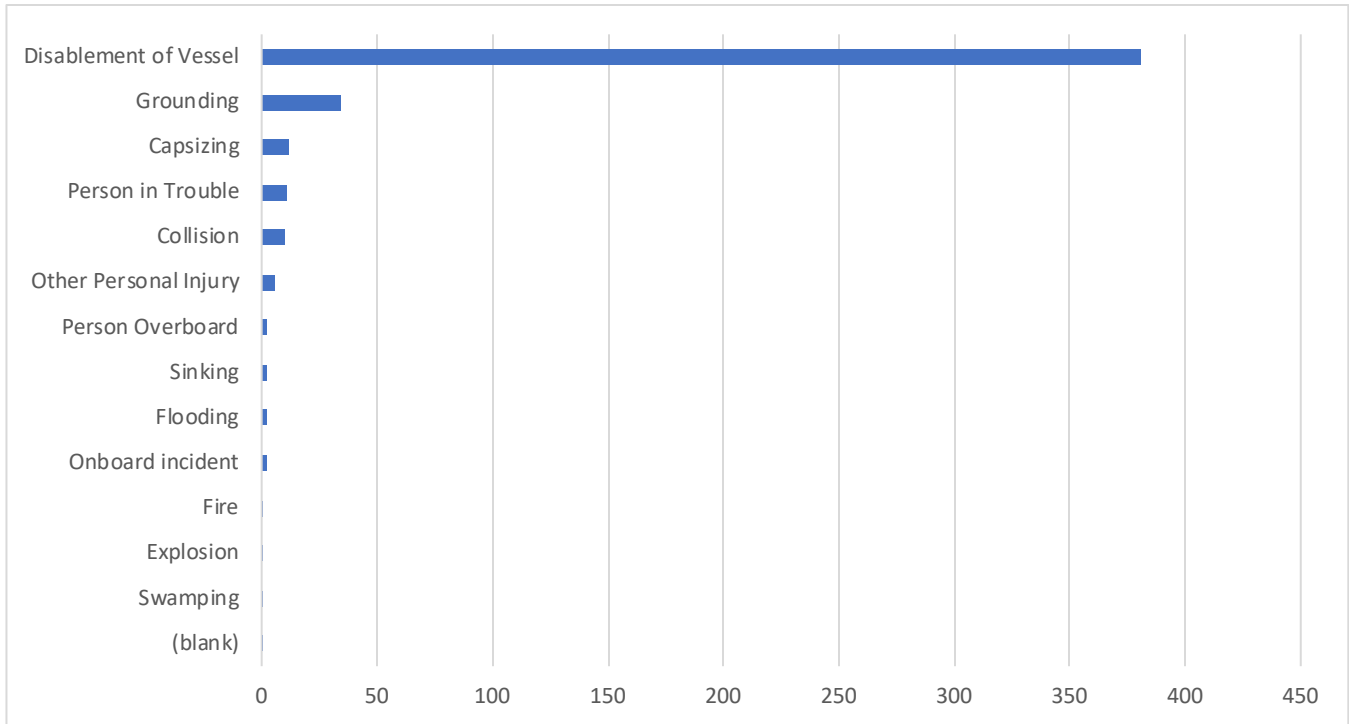
Graph 2 - Fleet by vessel type

As of the 31 March 2021 the total number of registered vessels for 2020-21 was **200,000**. This data covers both new registrations and renewals.



Graph 3 - Incidents

From 1 January to 31 March 2021 there were **466** recreational marine incidents. Most of these incidents (82%) were vessel disablements.

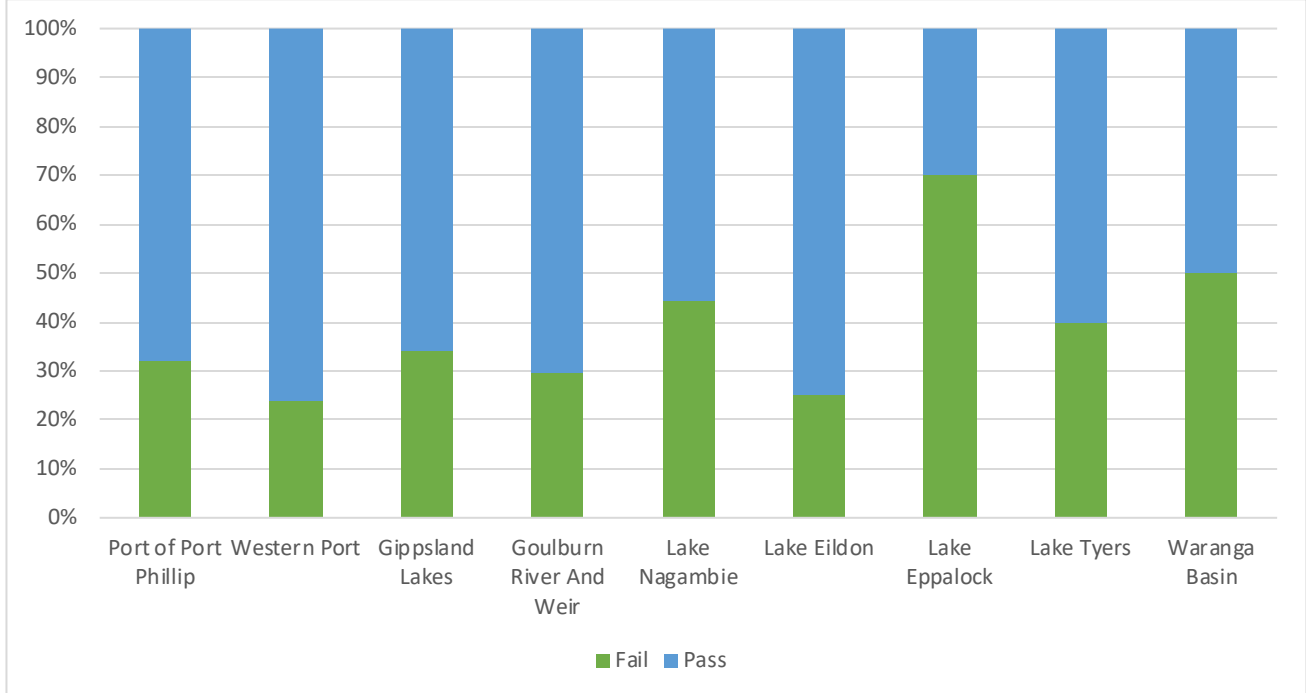


Incident management and maritime casualty quarter COVID-19 comparison.

Compliance monitoring

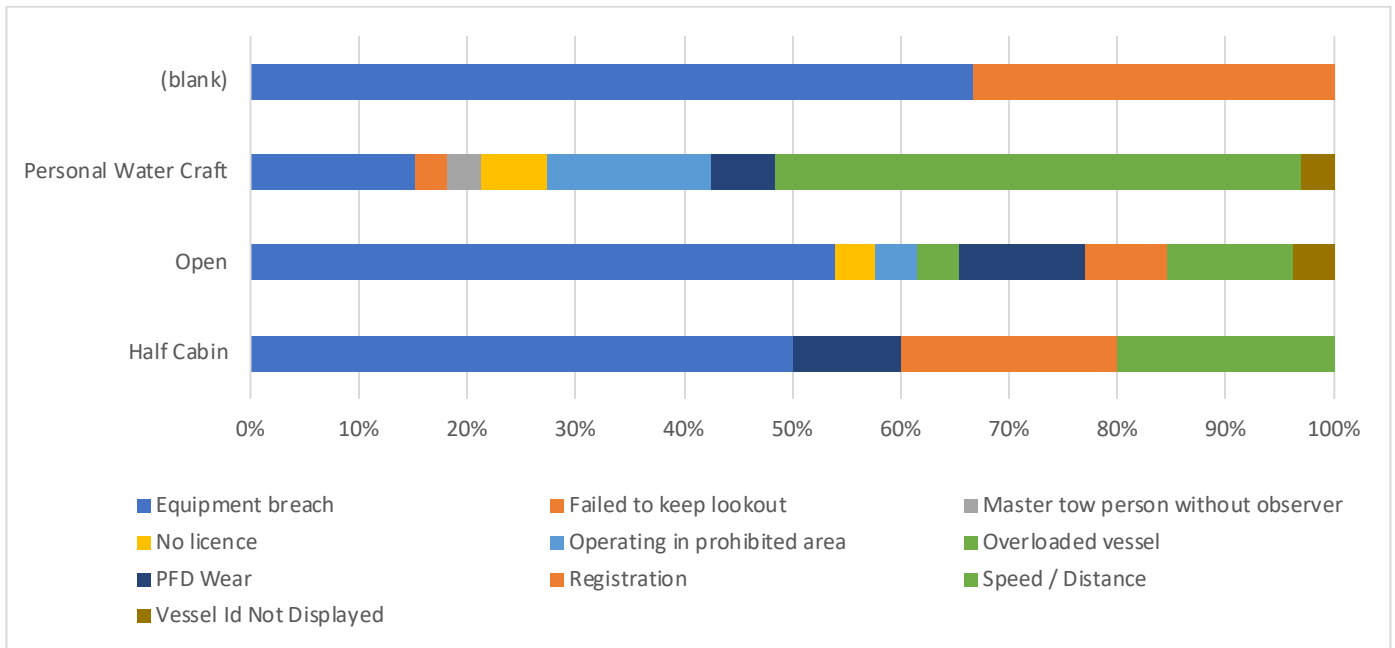
Graph 4 - MSV inspections by waterway

From 1 January to 31 March 2021, 67 per cent of the vessel inspections undertaken did not reveal any offences.



Graph 5 - MSV infringements by vessel type

From 1 January to 31 March 2021, the largest number of infringements issued (36 per cent) was for equipment breaches, followed by speed and distance breaches (29 per cent).



Graph 6 - MSV Infringements by Waterway

From 1 January to 31 March 2021, of the infringements issued, inland lakes saw a higher non-compliance rate with the carriage of correct equipment, the majority of enclosed waters saw a higher non-compliance in respect to speed and distance and carriage of correct equipment.
