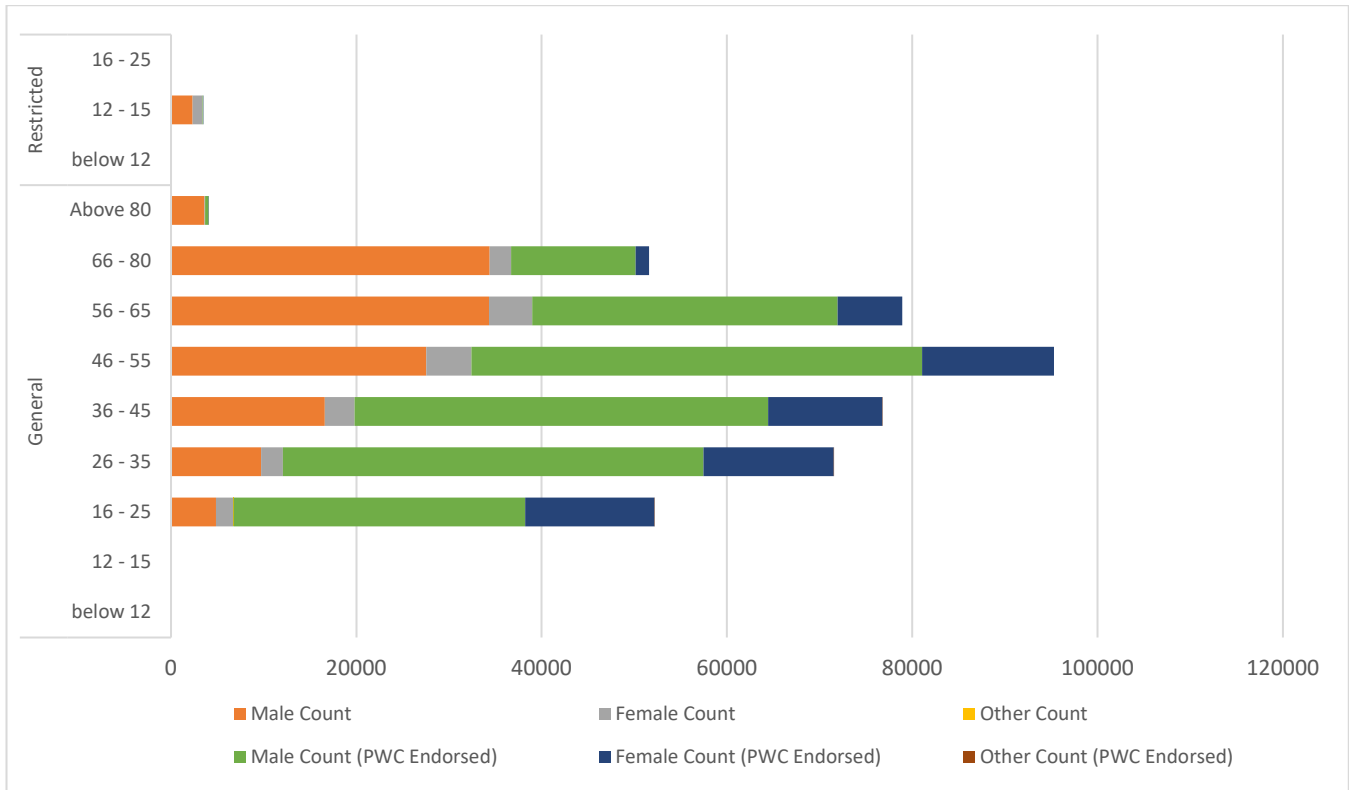

Registration and licensing numbers

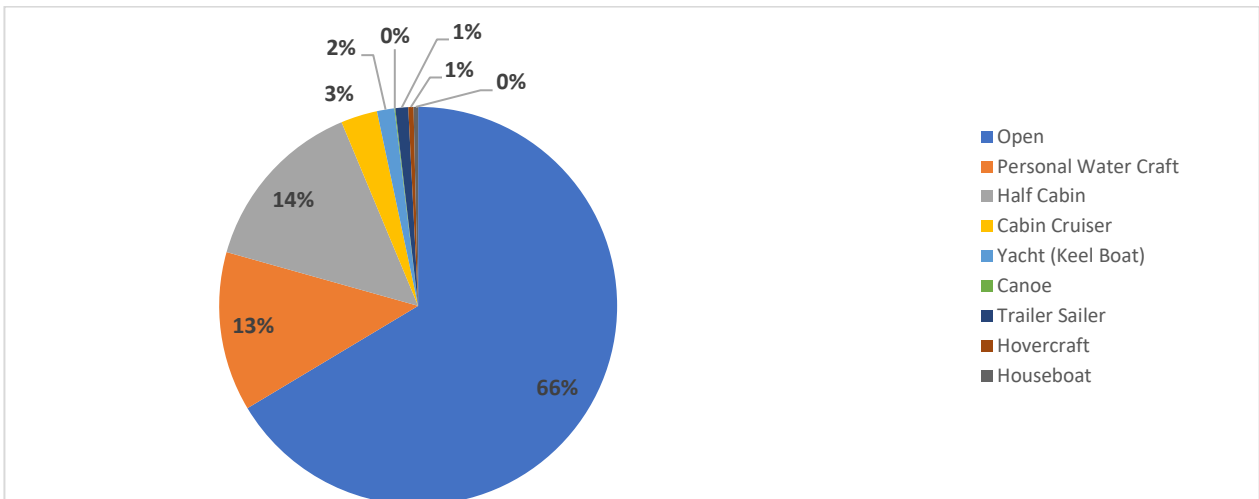
Graph 1 - Licence type by age and gender

As of 30 September 2021, the total number of Victorian recreational boating licence holders was **433,979**.



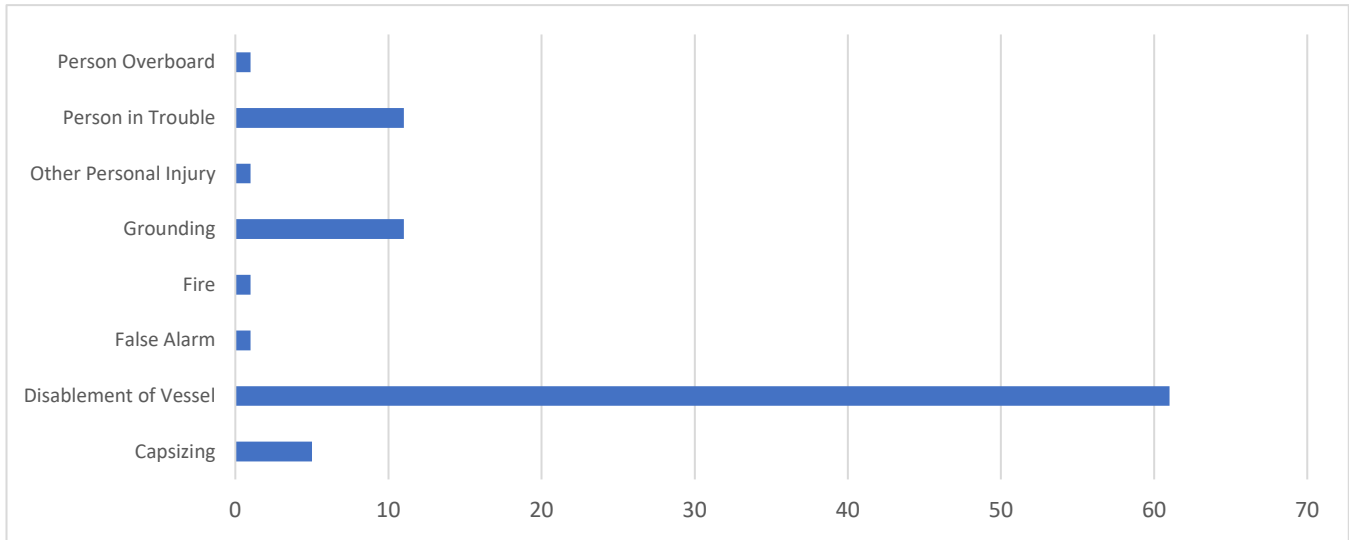
Graph 2 - Fleet by vessel type

As of 30 September 2021, the total number of registered vessels for was **200,066**. This data covers both new registrations and renewals.



Graph 3 - Incidents

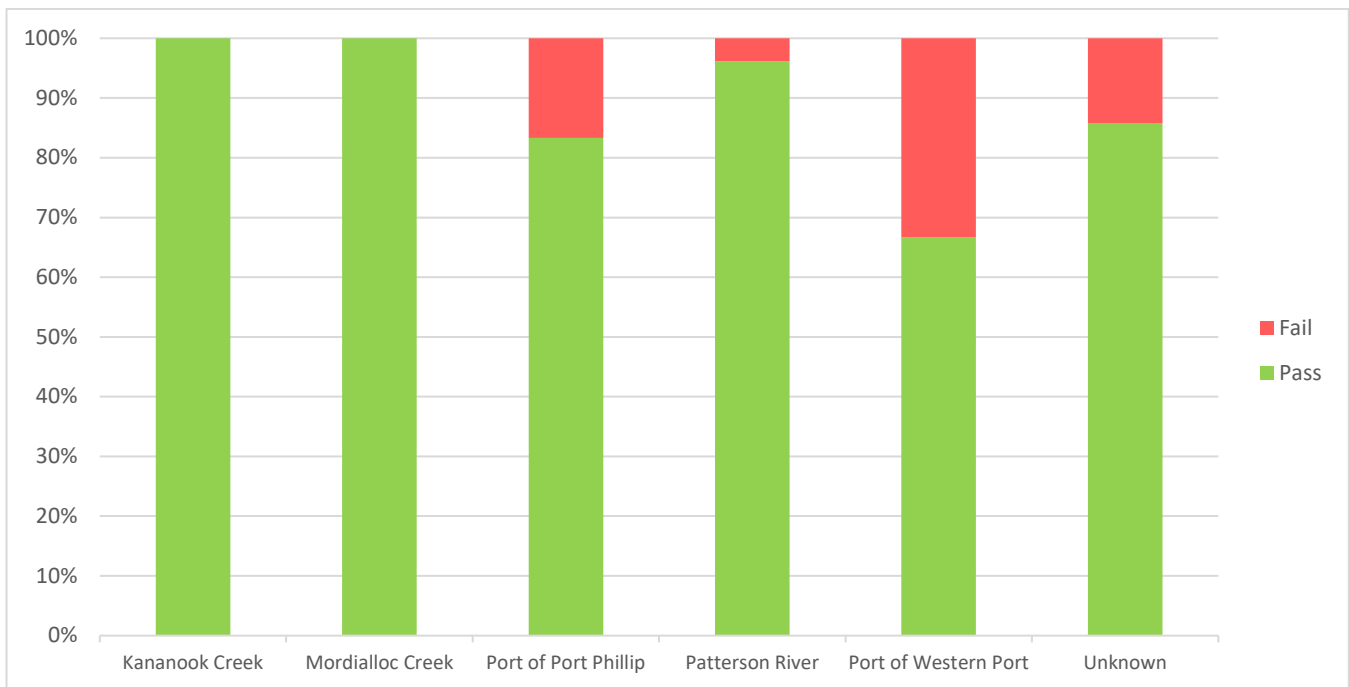
Between 1 July and 30 September 2021, there were **92** recreational marine incidents. Most of these incidents (66%) were vessel disablements.



Compliance monitoring

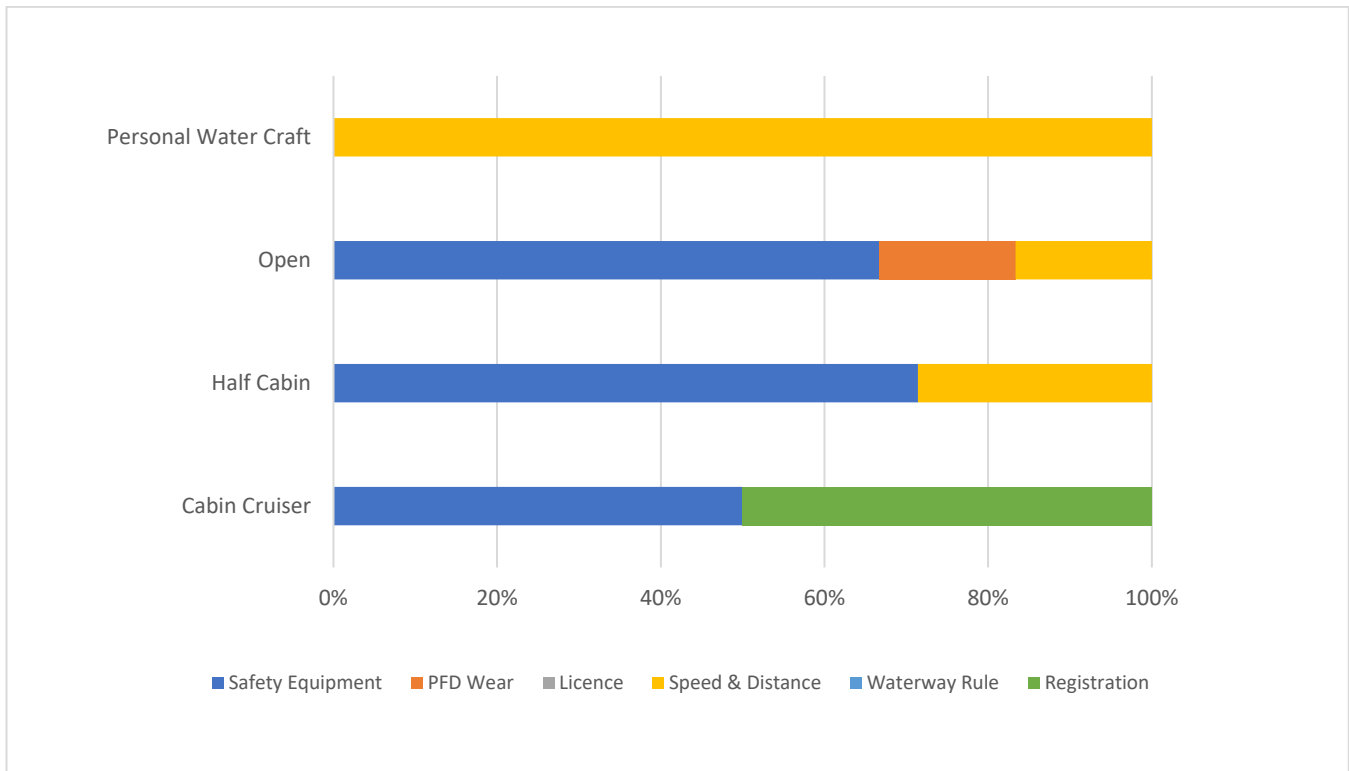
Graph 4 - MSV inspections by waterway

Between 1 July and 30 September 2021, 88% of the vessel inspections undertaken did not reveal any offences.



Graph 5 - MSV infringements by vessel type

From 1 July to 30 September 2021, the largest number of infringements issued were related to safety equipment (63%), followed by speed and distance breaches (25%). 81% of infringements issues this quarter were to persons on half cabin or open vessels.



Graph 6 - MSV Infringements by Waterway

From 1 July and 30 September 2021, of the infringements issued, all were conducted in enclosed waters. The majority Port of Port Phillip and Western Port's issued infringements were for breeches relating to safety equipment (63%) or speed and distance (25%).
