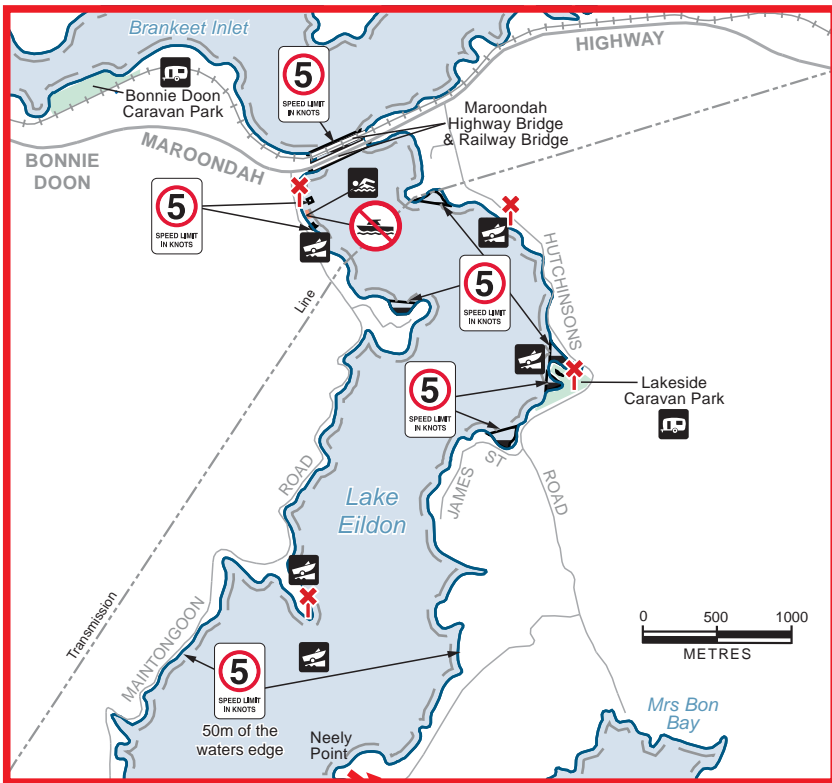
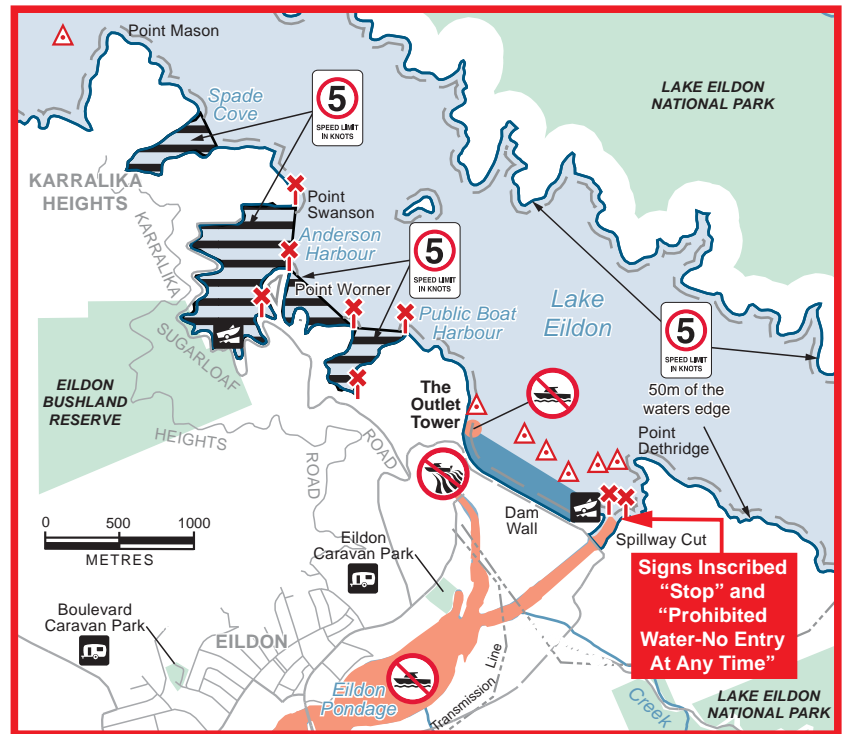




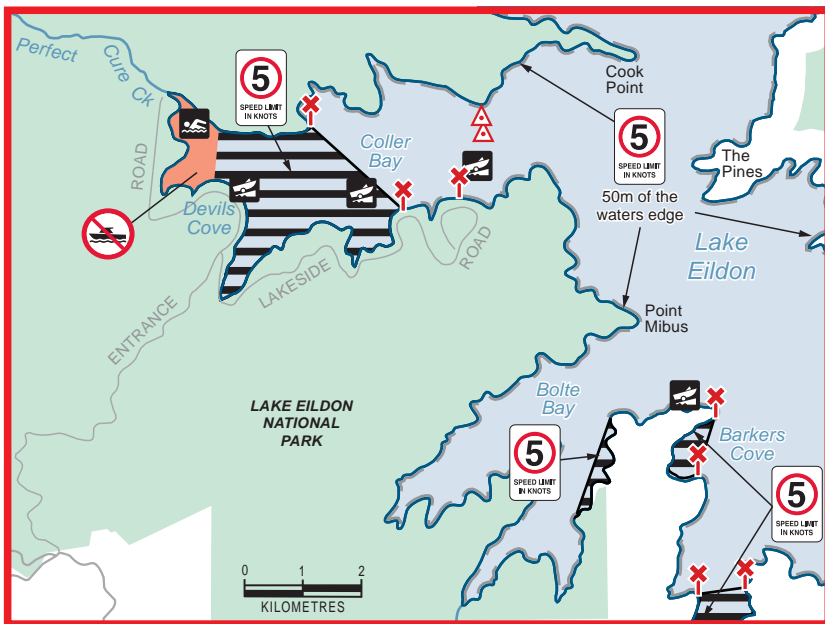
INSET A - DELATITE ARM



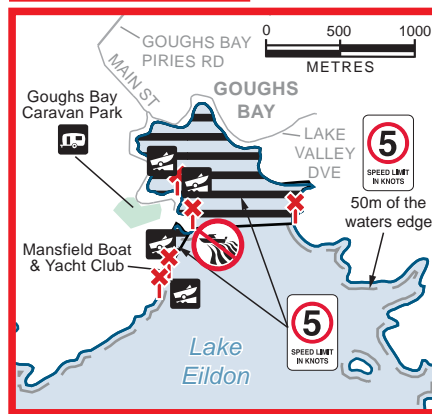
INSET C - THE OUTLET TOWER AND EILDON PONDAGE



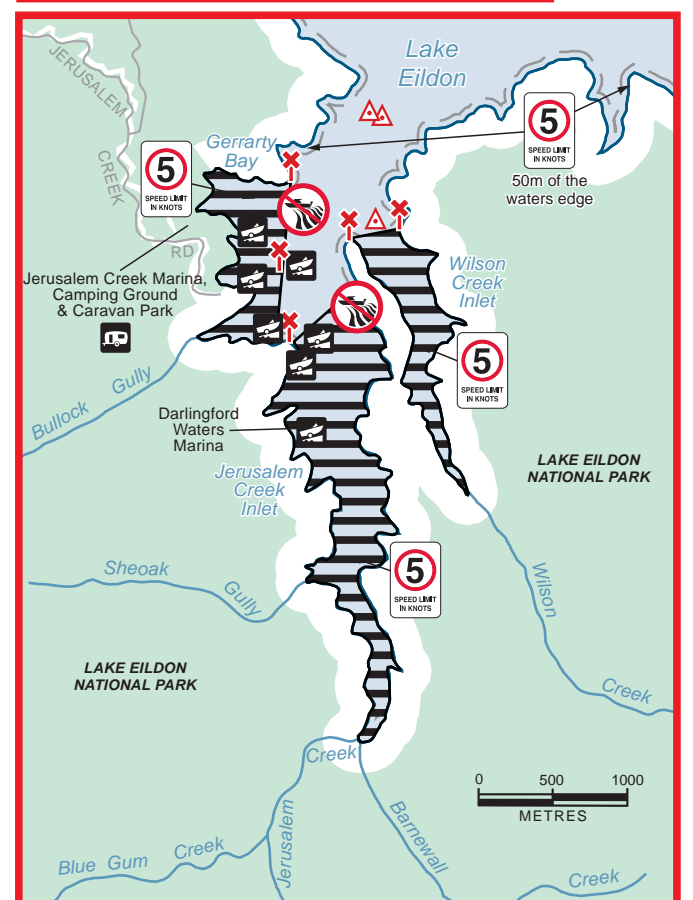
INSET B - COLLER BAY / BOLTE BAY

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

- ALL OCCUPANTS TO PUT ON PFDs**
PFDs must be easily accessible and all persons on board should know how to use them.
- INFORM** a person of your trip intentions
- CHECK** the marine weather report
- PHONE** Call 000
- MAINTAIN** a good lookout and operate at a safe speed

STAY WITH YOUR BOAT
A vessel is a lot easier to spot than a swimmer. Anchor your boat to maintain position if safe to do so.

No Wash Zones
The waters of Lake Eildon are no wash zones within 40 metres of the houseboats or cabin cruisers moored to marinas or on swing moorings.

Waterway Manager - Goulburn-Murray Water (Ph: 5833 5500)

- Waters of Lake Eildon and Eildon Pondage
- Waters outside those specified in Schedule 90
- Speed Limit Zone

- Waters where vessels with engines are prohibited

A person must not operate a vessel on the waters of Lake Eildon and the Eildon Pondage at a speed exceeding 5 knots -
 (a) within 50 metres of the waters edge; or
 (b) within 50 metres of a fixed or floating structure in or on the water - except in an access lane
