## ALL OCCUPANTS TO PUT ON PFDs

PFDs must be easily accessible and all persons on board should know how to use them.



## INFORM

a person of your trip intentions



## CHECK

the marine weather report

Call 000



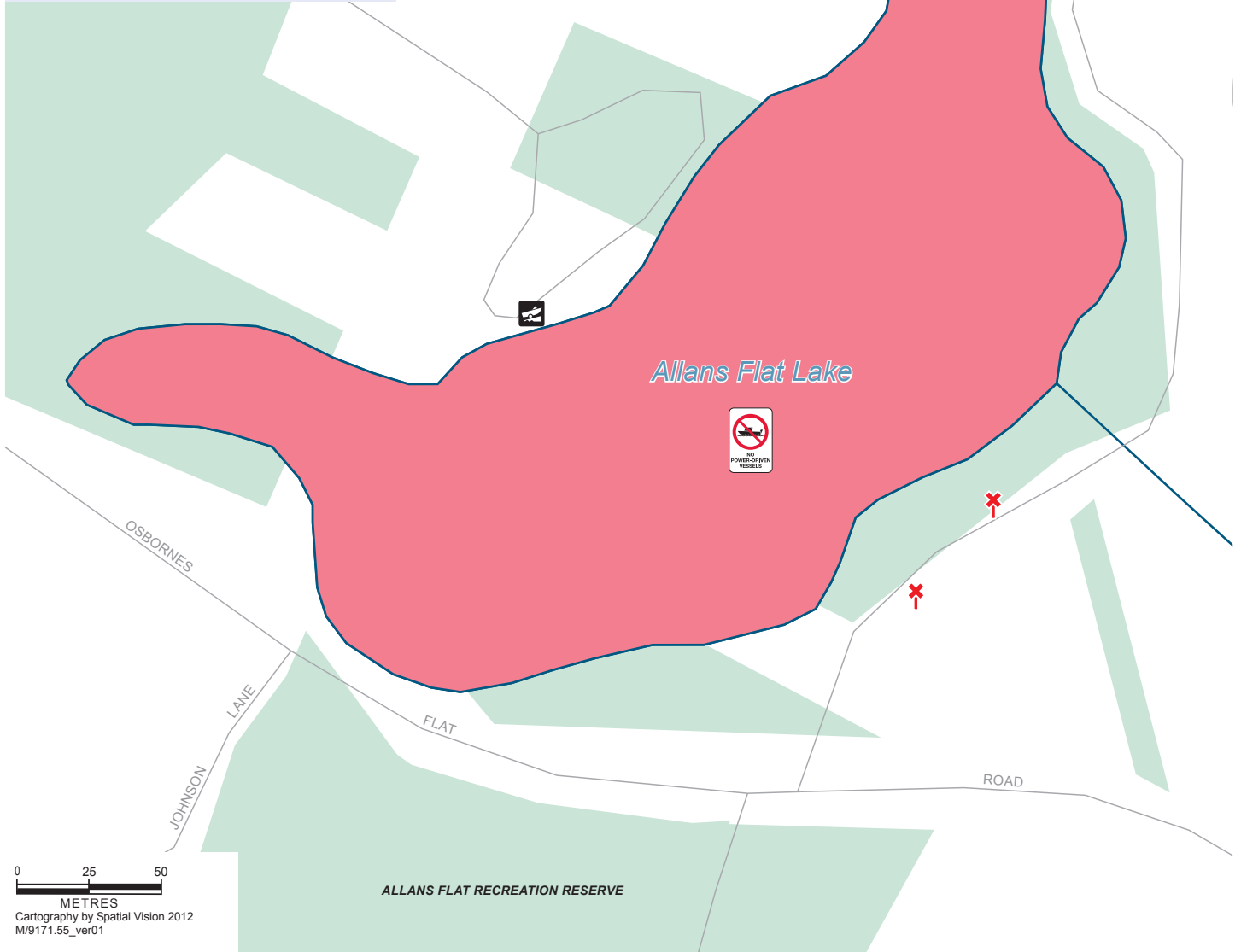
## MAINTAIN

a good lookout and operate at a safe speed



## STAY WITH YOUR BOAT

A vessel is a lot easier to spot than a swimmer. Anchor your boat to maintain position if safe to do so.

Waters of Allans Flat Lake

Waters where vessels with engines are prohibited

No Powered Vessels

Boat Ramp



A person must not operate a vessel on the waters of Allans Flat Lake at a speed exceeding 5 knots -  
 (a) within 50 metres of the waters edge; or  
 (b) within 50 metres of a fixed or floating structure in or on the water - except in an access lane
