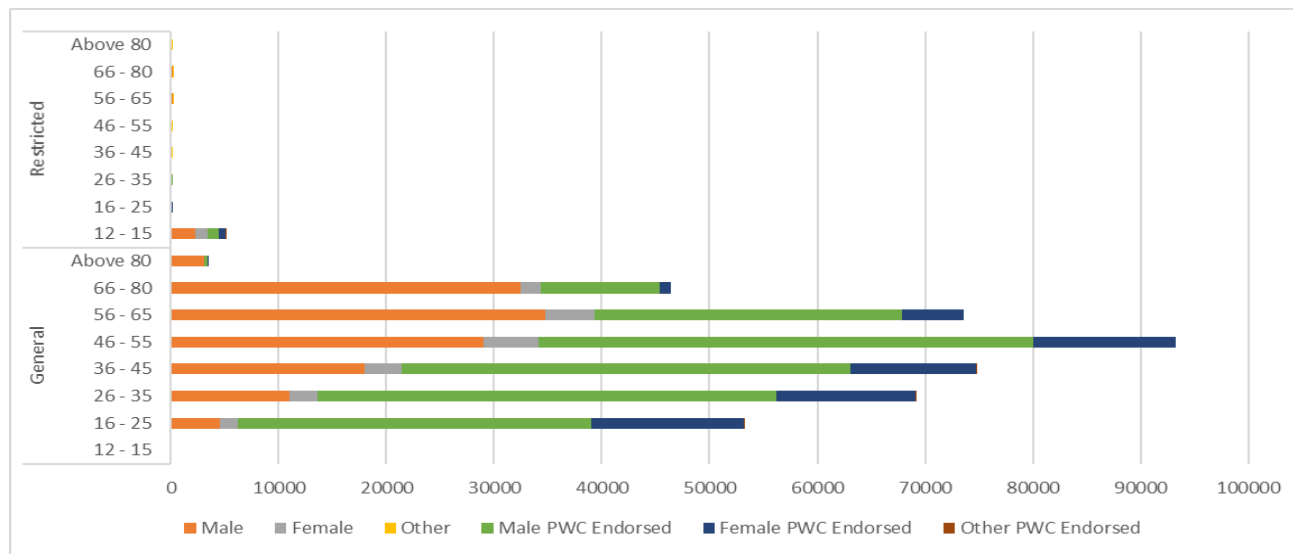

Registration and Licensing Numbers

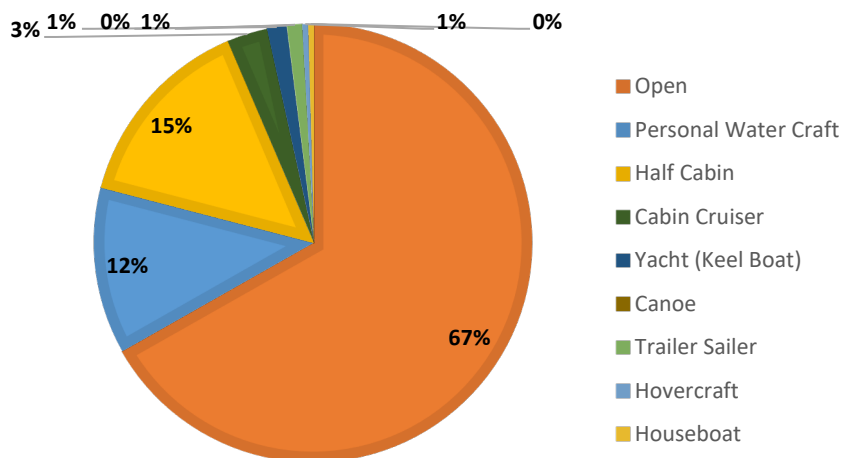
Graph 1 - Licence type by Age and Gender

As of 1 March 2020, there are 419,000 Victorian recreational boating licence holders.



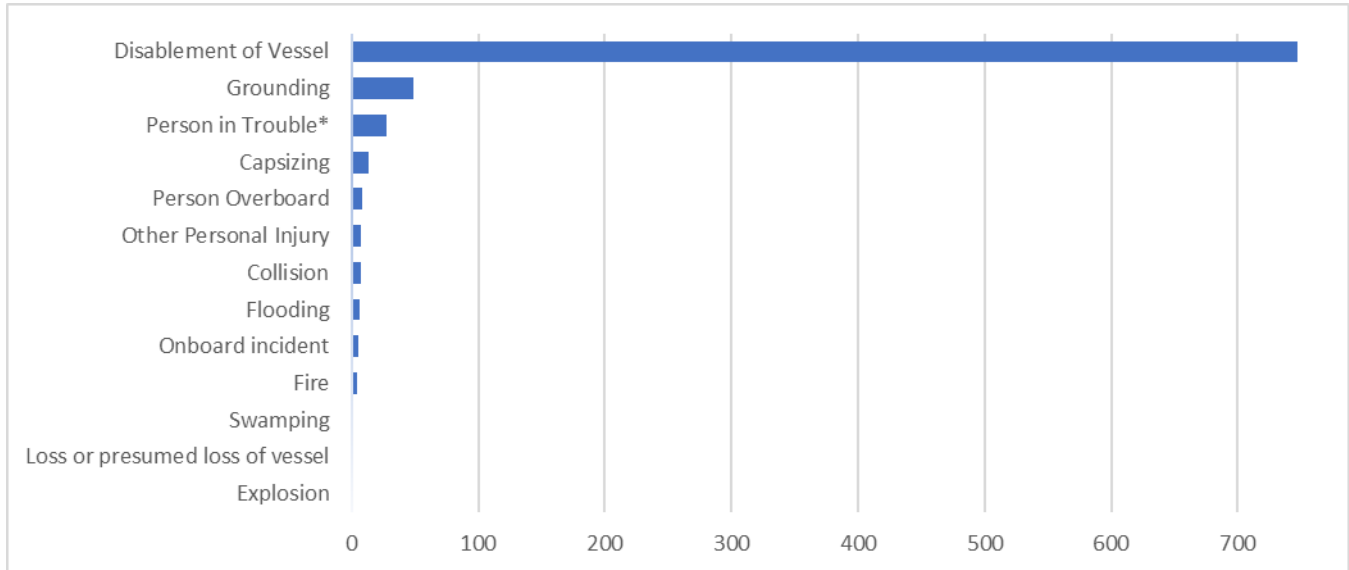
Graph 2 - Fleet by Vessel Type

As of 1 March 2020 the total number of registered vessels is 195,000. This data covers both new registrations and renewals. In the last five years vessel registrations have increased 2.8% overall. Note: there was a .2% increase from the 2018 FY to 2019 FY, with the key driver for the increase being PWC registrations.



Graph 3 - Incidents

From July 2019 to 1 March 2020, there have been 877 recreational marine incidents. The majority of these incidents (85%) were vessel disablements, followed by groundings (6%).

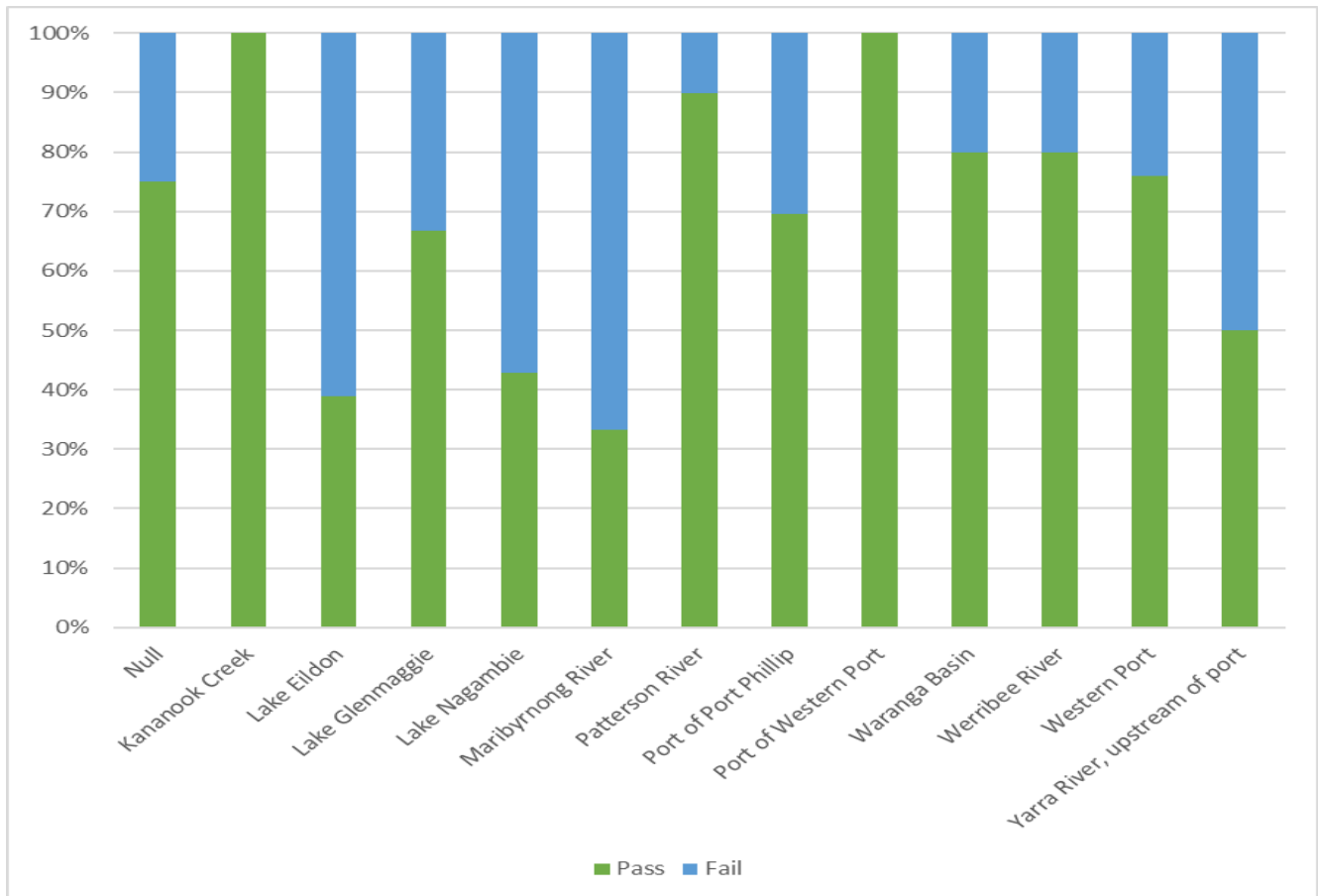

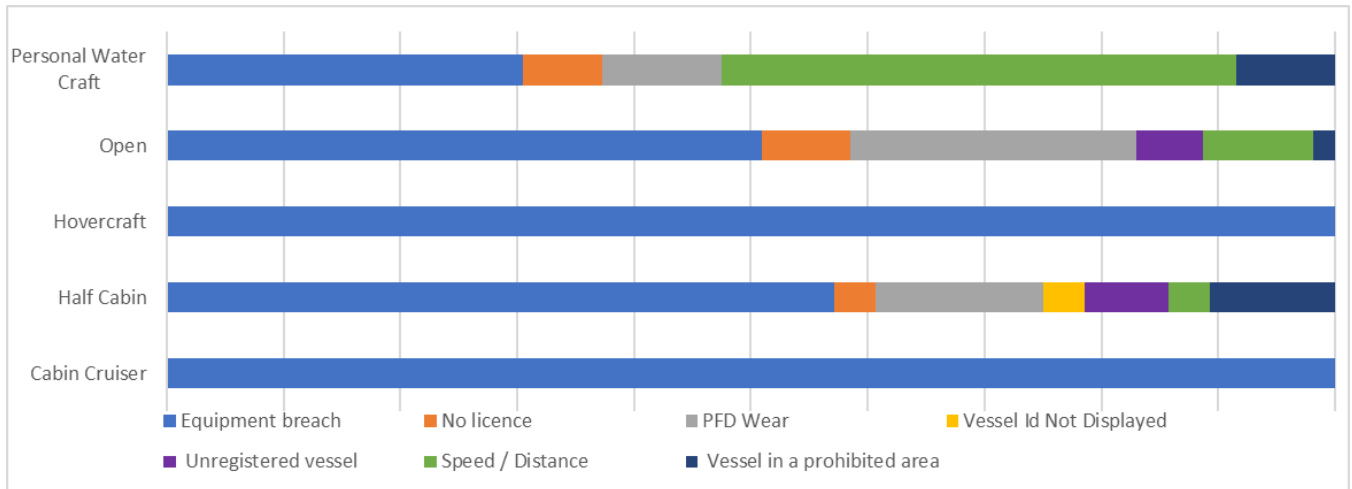
Graph 4 - MSV Inspections by waterway

From July 2019 to 1 March 2020, of the vessel inspections undertaken 71% of inspections passed (i.e. the inspection did not detect any offences).



Graph 5 - MSV Infringements by Vessel Type

From July 2019 to 1 March 2020, the majority of infringements issued (46%) were for breaches of safety equipment, followed by speed and distance breaches (22%)



Graph 6 - MSV Infringements by Waterway

From July 2019 to 1 March 2020, of the infringements issued, inland lakes saw a higher non-compliance rate with personal floatation device (PFD) wear, the majority of enclosed waters saw a higher non-compliance in respect to the carriage of correct equipment.
