ALL OCCUPANTS TO PUT ON PFDs
PFDs must be easily accessible and all persons on board should know how to use them.



INFORM
a person of your trip intentions



CHECK
the marine weather report



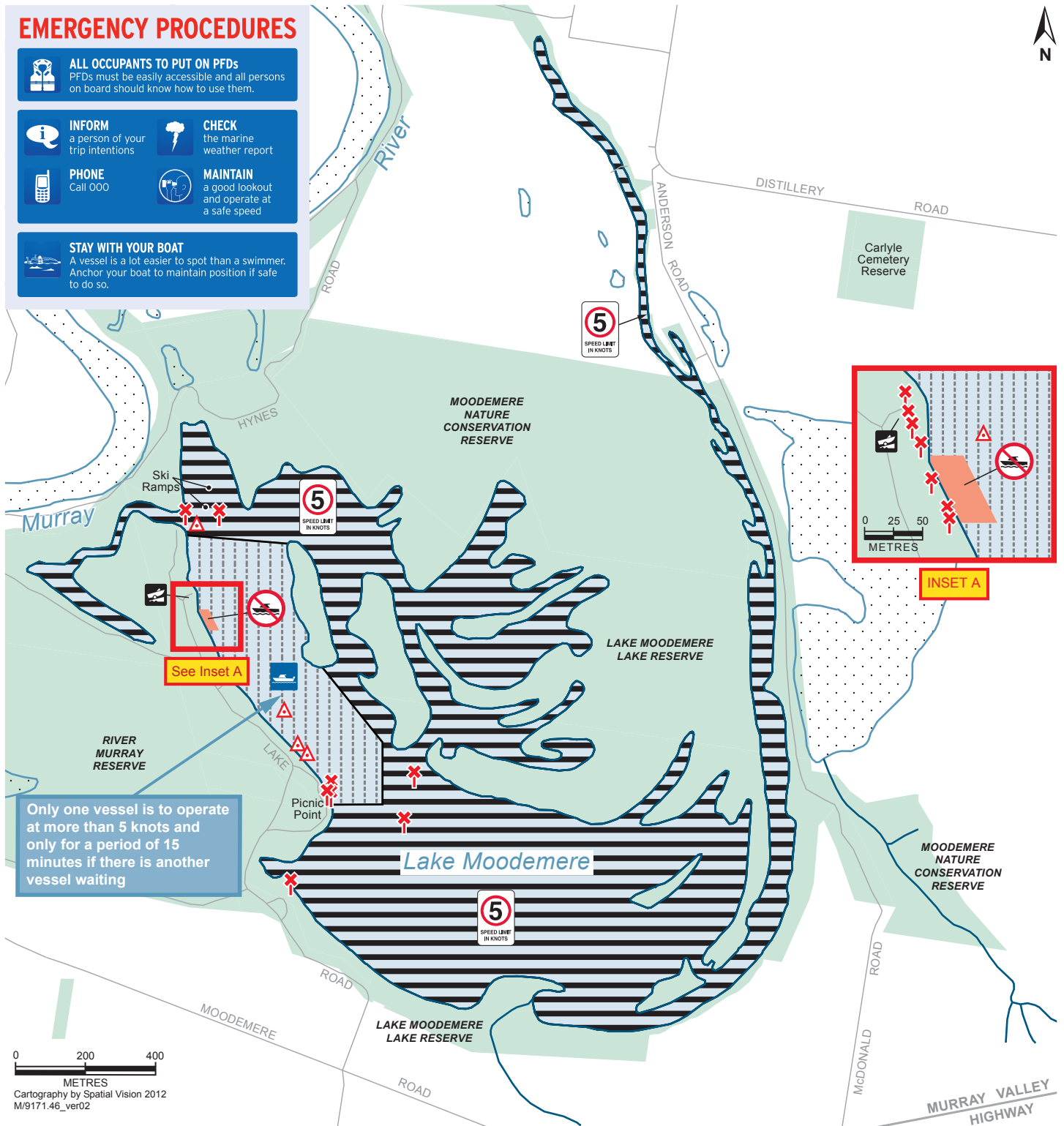

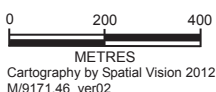
MAINTAIN
a good lookout and operate at a safe speed



STAY WITH YOUR BOAT
A vessel is a lot easier to spot than a swimmer. Anchor your boat to maintain position if safe to do so.



Only one vessel is to operate at more than 5 knots and only for a period of 15 minutes if there is another vessel waiting

A person must not operate a vessel on the waters of Lake Moodemere at a speed exceeding 5 knots within 50 metres of a fixed or floating structure in or on the water - except in an access lane
